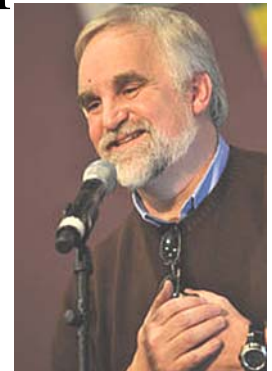

Refugee resettlement partners are invited to participate in a Refugee Summit for refugees and local ABCOPAD church leaders and ministry partners at the Westgate Baptist Church; 2235 Old Harrisburg Pk; Lancaster, PA, 17601, June 8-9, 2010.

The God of the Ages has challenged followers to provide for those who have fled their homeland and find themselves in a far-away land with so many uncertainties. Much can be learned from the refugees and the local church leaders and ministry partners. Working together may help all of us to develop better resettlement practices across our Region. By bringing representatives together in what we are calling a Refugee Summit, we can make great strides. ## Denominational Leaders Address Immigration

*'And when did we see thee a stranger and welcome thee, or naked and clothe thee? And when did we see thee sick or in prison and visit thee?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.'*

*(Matt 25:38-40)*

On May 6, a meeting was held at the Mission Center in Valley Forge to discuss how American Baptists might engage the issue of immigration and immigration reform. A letter was written and endorsed by many denominational leaders.

The letter is an open message promoting a view of immigration reform focused on mercy and justice, mirroring God's love for all of mankind. The letter is available on the American Baptist Churches USA website, at: <http://www.abc-usa.org>.

American Baptists have been in the forefront of welcoming immigrants into our country and churches for over 100 years. There is no one racial or ethnic group holding majority membership in the American Baptist Churches, USA.

General Secretary Roy Medley has noted, "There is broad agreement among Protestant leaders that immigration reform in our country must reflect mercy and justice rooted in God's love through 'immigration reform legislation that is consistent with humanitarian values, supports families, provides a pathway to citizenship for immigrant workers already in the US, expands legal avenues for workers to enter the U.S. with their rights and due process fully protected, and examines solutions to address the root causes of migration.'" (quoted by Evangelicals for Social Action from Christians for Comprehensive Immigration Reform-Sojourners) This moral framework is shared by Roman Catholic and Orthodox faith leaders as well."

## Galveston II: ABCOPAD President Rev. Mary Lewis Shares Her Experience



Our last evening in Galveston, we had the privilege of visiting the Mexican Baptist Church where Tim Schwartz ministers (and where the first Galveston team was housed). Some of the women made us a Mexican feast, followed by worship in their beautiful sanctuary. Two of the women – Lucy, who serves as a translator

for this bilingual church, and Eunice, the pianist – told us about what the church looked like after the hurricane – the flooding (there was 8 feet of water in the church) and mud, a huge stump in the middle of the sanctuary, the piano was broken apart. Eunice said she didn't even recognize it as a piano at first. Though it had been 18 months since it happened, and though we sat in a sanctuary that was completely refurbished and truly beautiful, tears filled the women's eyes as they told the story. *16 women – who were told by everyone that they should just give up on the church – refused to give up.*

Many churches helped with gifts of money, labor and materials, and that beautiful building stands as a constant testimony of their faith and of God's faithfulness. There were many tears that flowed (and not just from Lucy & Eunice!) as we stood around in a circle and prayed. As my turn to pray came around, I said that the sense of God's presence was so "heavy" in that place – as if all the love and generosity and the prayers of those who had given to restore that sanctuary lingered in that place. There was just such a powerful experience of the Lord's presence as soon as I walked into the room - and I'm not someone who says those kinds of things very often!

I felt humbled and honored to just stand in that place, to worship and to pray with those women of faith, as well as the team who had so blessed me all week with love, laughter and joy. *I suspect that my week in Galveston will forever define for me what true Christian fellowship is.*

On April 18-24, Pastor Dave Cox of FBC of Greenville led 18 volunteers (the 2nd ABCOPAD Mission Team this year) to Galveston. He believes that American Baptist are making a difference and experiencing spiritual revival in the process.

## National Ministries Reclaims Historic Name

On April 27, the anniversary of its founding, in a day devoted to worship and celebration Executive Director, Dr. Aidsand Wright-Riggins announced that National Ministries was reclaiming its historic names and would now carry out ministry as American Baptist Home Mission Societies. Our birth names state clearly who we are and what we are called to do in this second decade of the 21st century. We are American Baptists, networked and focused on doing and enabling mission here in the United States of America and Puerto Rico.

The name represents the joining of the organization founded in 1832 with the Woman's American Baptist Home Mission Society (founded in 1887) in 1955 and the eventual assimilation of the Baptist General Tract Society, founded in 1824, along with The American Baptist Education Society, founded in 1888, and through the absorption of Educational Ministries in 2003. Board President Dr. Clifford Johnson says, "By doing ministry as American Baptist Home Mission Societies, we honor the various threads of our history."

Morning worship lifted up the legacy of two historical figures in The American Baptist Home Mission Society. Rev. Dr. Al Staggs — a performing artist from Albuquerque, NM — presented an original dramatization of John Mason Peck, a founder of The American Baptist Home Mission Society who traveled throughout the early 19th century frontier preaching, teaching and planting churches. Dr. Anthea Butler, Associate Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, shared the story of Joanna P. Moore — who devoted her lifetime to working with freed slaves — challenging those present to look at 21st century mission with the same sacrificial perspective.

Lunch at The Interchurch Center featured American Baptist Historian Dr. William Brackney — a professor of Christian Theology and Ethics at Acadia Divinity College in Nova Scotia — who addressed "Heritage & Home Mission: Connecting with 21st Century Missional Synergies."

The day closed with worship, which included a service of communion and consecration, at The Riverside Church. Rev. Dr. Al Staggs dramatized excerpts from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s "Beyond Vietnam" speech, delivered at the church in 1967. Dr. Adam Bond — Assistant Professor of Historical Studies at Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology in Richmond, VA — preached, reminding those gathered of the sacrifice of God the King, through the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, that offers redemption to all believers as well as a model for ministry and service.

## International Ministries Announces New Missionary Endorsements

IM partner The Council of Baptist Churches in North East India (CBCNEI).

Working with the leadership of CBCNEI, Katie will provide worship and counseling training to churches in North East India and share her gifts in missionary training. Taku will work with the mission secretaries of CBCNEI to provide the pre-field and in-service training to missionaries; to equip churches to better support their sponsored missionaries; and to visit and provide pastoral care to the missionaries in their areas.

Taku was a beneficiary of the ministry of the early AB missionaries in North East India. His grandfather was one of the first converts of his village, and his parents served as missionaries to an unreached neighboring tribe still practicing head-hunting.

J.D. and Rhonda Reed will serve in theological education for both lay leaders and pastors, in starting new work and in development of the work in the Santa Cruz de la Sierra and the southern part of Bolivia. The Reeds will also interpret the ministries of The Union Bautista Boliviana in the U.S. and globally.

"About five years ago our church became a part of Mario and Iris Morales' [IM missionaries in Bolivia] MPN and, since then, the thought of finally taking the step seemed much easier. ## **Outflow: Outward-Focused Living in a Self-Focused World** **Steve Sjogren & Dave Ping, Loveland, IL: Group Publishing, 2006**

There have been hundreds of books written about evangelism and outreach in the last decade. Many of them focus on programs and formulas. The best ones emphasize the source of all outreach – a deep, abundant, satisfying relationship with God that can't be contained, but has to be shared with others.

*Outflow is about a richer relationship with God.*

*A relationship like it was intended. Powerful. Intimate. Constant. (p. 4)*

*Outflow: Outward-Focused Living in a Self-Focused World*, is such a book. Rather than offering a pre-packaged approach to doing outreach, Sjogren (author of several books, including *Conspiracy of Kindness*, and a Vineyard Church pastor) and Ping (author of *Irresistible Evangelism*, and Executive Director of Equipping Ministries International) have written a book about God's "living water" that fills each one of us – when we allow it to – and naturally overflows into our homes, our workplaces, our schools, and our communities.

*Outflow is about overflowing into your community. It's about reaching out with God's love to everyone around you. It's about natural and relationship ways of engaging with the people of your city. It's about serving them with no strings attached. It's about loving them with God's love. (p. 5)*

*Outflow* is for anyone who has realized "there is little or no fruit in being a passive, silent Christian" (p. 140). It's a great resource for individuals, small groups, or churches who have recognized the need to be outward focused, but who need a little help...maybe even a push...to get started.

*Outflow* is designed to be read over five weeks, with one reading a day. (Although there's no harm in a quicker reading!) The five major sections of the book are: A life overflowing; Outward toward God; Outward toward family and friends; Outward toward your community; and Outward toward your world.

Each section consists of five brief chapters. Each chapter is followed by "Getting your feet wet," reflective activities and hands-on experiences that focus on the day's reading, and "The reflection pool," questions designed to help you move deeper into the day's topic.

Each section (every five readings) is followed by "Diving into the deep end," a hands-on experience to help you apply what you read during the previous five days, and group discussion questions. This format makes this a great resource for Sunday School classes or other small groups.

A quote from the back cover explains the overall focus of the book: "*Outflow* introduces you to principles for enjoying a life that's filled to the brim with God's love, joy, and hope. It starts with a deep relationship with God, then flows out to touch your family and friends. Your neighbors. Your world. They'll notice a difference...and so will you. Get ready to experience God's love in a new way – and to share it with others in a manner that's natural, simple, and heart-felt."

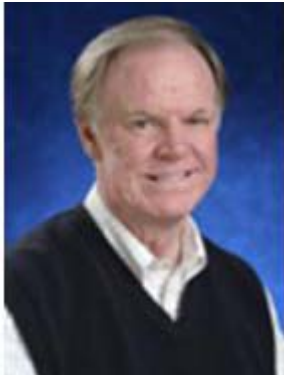

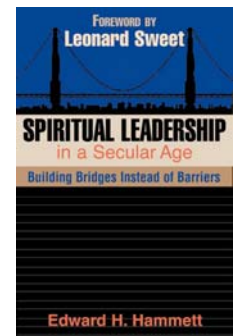

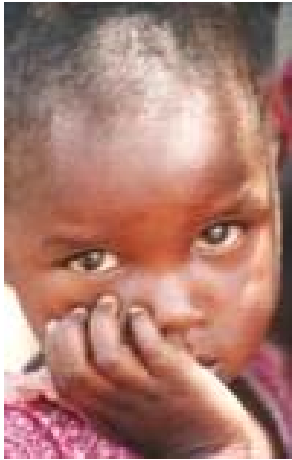

## Haiti Mission Trip ~ January 2011



All of us are painfully aware of the human suffering taking place in Haiti following the earthquake that struck that country earlier this year. Most of us are also aware of the many faith based groups that have started making plans to travel to Haiti in an effort to assist in the on-going relief efforts. What you may not know is the American Baptist Churches of Pennsylvania and Delaware, even before the earthquake, had planned to lead a mission trip to Haiti in 2011.

ABCOPAD started a three-year cycle of mission projects in 2008 / 2009 beginning with the Habitat Build right here in our own Region. Having completed the build in January 2009, 2010 focused on a national mission trip to Galveston, Texas, to assist in the Hurricane Ike relief effort. The goal of the Region was to lead an international mission trip in 2011 to Haiti.

Over the last few months, our Region has been working with Herb and Bernice Rogers to lead a mission trip to Haiti in January 2011. We are currently planning a 10-day work trip to Haiti during the weeks of January 16 and January 23. Our hope is to take a group of 16 people to Haiti. Initial estimates place the cost of the trip around \$1,600 (airfare, room, meals and mission material costs).

Herb is currently checking on needs in the country. Historically, American Baptists have worked in the Northern section of Haiti. A number of years ago, teams from ABCOPAD assisted in building projects in Cap Haitien. Of course, currently there is great need for relief efforts in the south following the earthquake that devastated the area around Port-au-Prince.
